Also one of the real world problems is getting more students into the US to study. Our typical costs are prohibitive. Beria College in Kentucky, [redacted] charges no tuition but requires all students to work and attracts a lot of foreign students.

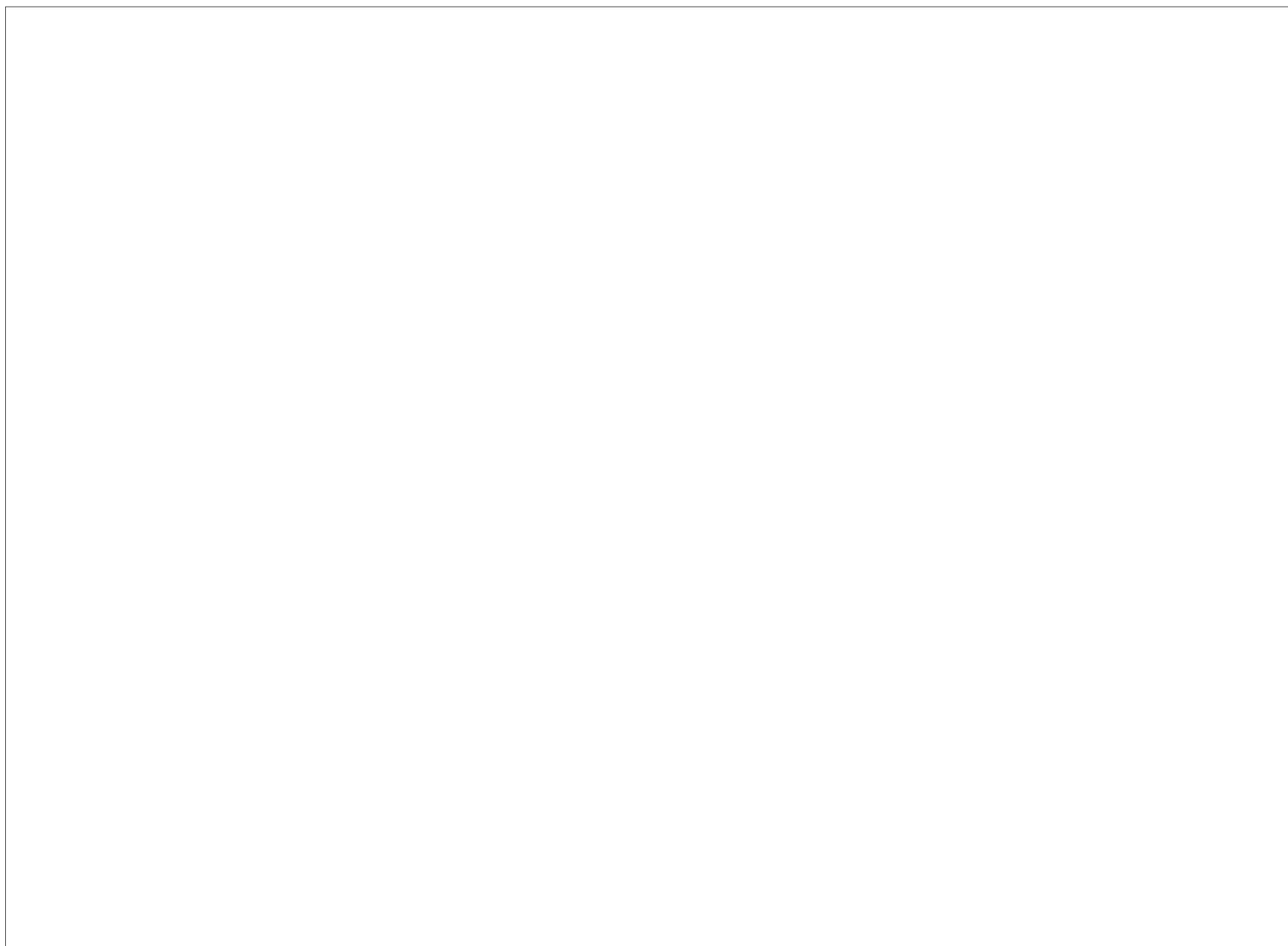
Subject: Higher Education Dinner on August 17 - Proposed Guest List
