I. Committee Nomination Status

The Advisory Committee on Persons with Disabilities has three vacancies at this time. Additionally, taking into consideration the recommendations of committee Executive Director, Stephanie Ortoleva, we have conducted an evaluation of existing committee members, and feel that reorganization is warranted, opening an additional two vacancies for a **total of five slots**.

Based on parameters above, we have conducted interviews and selected the five candidates detailed below. We believe each bring diversity and innovation to the committee, coming from various careers, with expertise in a variety of disability issue areas. Of our five candidates, two came through the WHL office ([redacted]), two from the open application process with the recommendation of the committee staff ([redacted] and [redacted]) and one from both the Obama PPO staff as well as the Committee staff's recommendations ([redacted]).
