(SBU) The European Parliament voted against a deal that would have given the United States access to European bank transfers to track funds supporting terror groups, media report. The parliament's president, Jerzy Buzek, said the assembly wants more safeguards for civil liberties. USEU comments the agreement was rejected by a vote of 378 to 196 with 31 abstentions.

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
