H: When Madeleine first became Secretary of State, I organized a group of people for her to discuss the anniversary of the Marshall Plan to prepare her for her speech. Some were younger, but most were like [redacted] etc. We had a long dinner. It was, I think, fruitful for her. (I recall Greg Craig there, then as head of Policy Planning.) There are a lot of people not in government who have expertise and judgment that are not being tapped, some of them younger. There are of course a number of people who have not been tapped into the administration and wish to be. [redacted] for example, is someone I've talked with recently, who very much wants to serve as an ambassador or in some capacity.) [redacted], whom I mentioned, and whose CV [redacted] I've included below, is someone who is very knowledgeable, tough minded, has ideas, and is capable, in his 40s. He's the kind of person who might be considered to succeed Anne-Marie Slaughter. There are others out there: [redacted] for example, who you may remember [redacted] is incredibly effective, but has been kept out of this administration because as a lawyer he's had to register as a lobbyist. He's one of many. Really counter-productive to develop such self-undermining rules. [redacted] thinks hard about diplomacy, and we've been in conversation about how to develop these ideas further. The younger generation is interesting. [redacted] is worth paying attention to, among them. More to discuss. Sid
