BRASILIA, Oct 3 (Reuters) - Brazil's ruling Workers' Party expects its presidential candidate Dilma Rousseff to fall short of clinching a first-round victory on Sunday, and she will have to face a runoff against opposition candidate Jose Serra on Oct. 31, a high-ranking source in the party told Reuters.

With 53 percent of votes counted, she has got about 44 percent of the valid votes. She would need 50 percent plus one of the valid votes to avert a runoff. (Reporting by Natuza Nery)
