#### **Japanese support PM's call to do away with nuclear power**

TOKYO (Reuters) - More than two-thirds of Japanese support Prime Minister Kan's call to do away with nuclear power, a media poll showed, underscoring growing opposition to atomic energy in the wake of the crisis at the Fukushima Dai-ichi plant.

#### **UN chief calls for Malawi to resolve differences**

**BLANTYRE (AP)** - A UN statement said UNSYG Ban, in a July 23 phone conversation with Malawi President Mutharika, expressed sadness over the deaths from clashes between demonstrators and police. Ban urged the human rights of those in jail be guaranteed.

### **Congo opposition picks ex-VP as presidential bid**

**KINSHASA (AP)** - Congo's opposition party says it chose former vice president Jean-Pierre Bemba as its presidential candidate for November elections. Bemba faces charges of murder, rape, and pillage at the International Criminal Court at The Hague.

### **Newspaper says South Africa's Malema using secret fund**

**JOHANNESBURG (Reuters)** - A South African newspaper alleged on July 24 that influential politician Julius Malema, who heads the ruling ANC's Youth League, used a secret trust fund to finance a lavish lifestyle that includes luxury cars and property.

### **Italian ship seized off West African coast**

**ROME (Reuters)** - An Italian tanker carrying a cargo of diesel fuel was seized by pirates in the Gulf of Guinea in West Africa. The ship, the RBD Anema e Core with a crew of 23 on board, was taken in the early hours July 24 when a number of assailants boarded. Two of the crew are Italians, the others Filipinos and Romanians.
