Xi gave a speech today at an ASEAN gathering in which observers interpreted him as toughening China's rhetoric on SCS issues – he elevated the sovereignty discussion above the peaceful resolution discussion: "We are firm in safeguarding China's sovereignty, security and territorial integrity and are committed to resolving differences with neighbours concerning territorial land, territorial sea and maritime rights and interests peacefully through friendly negotiations." 1.4(B)
